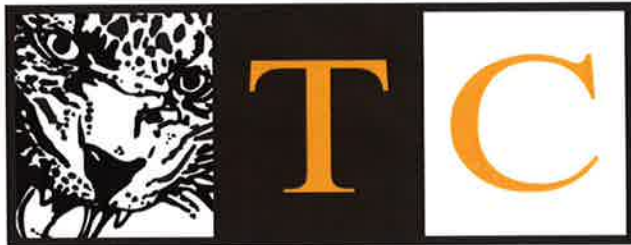

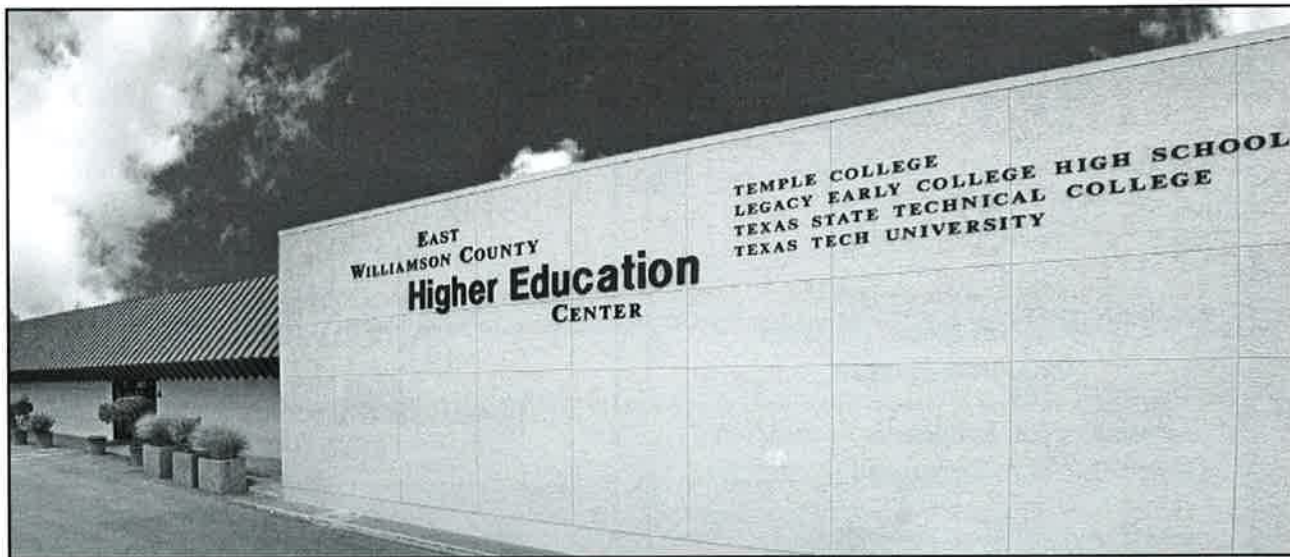

DEVELOPMENTAL COURSE OFFERINGS

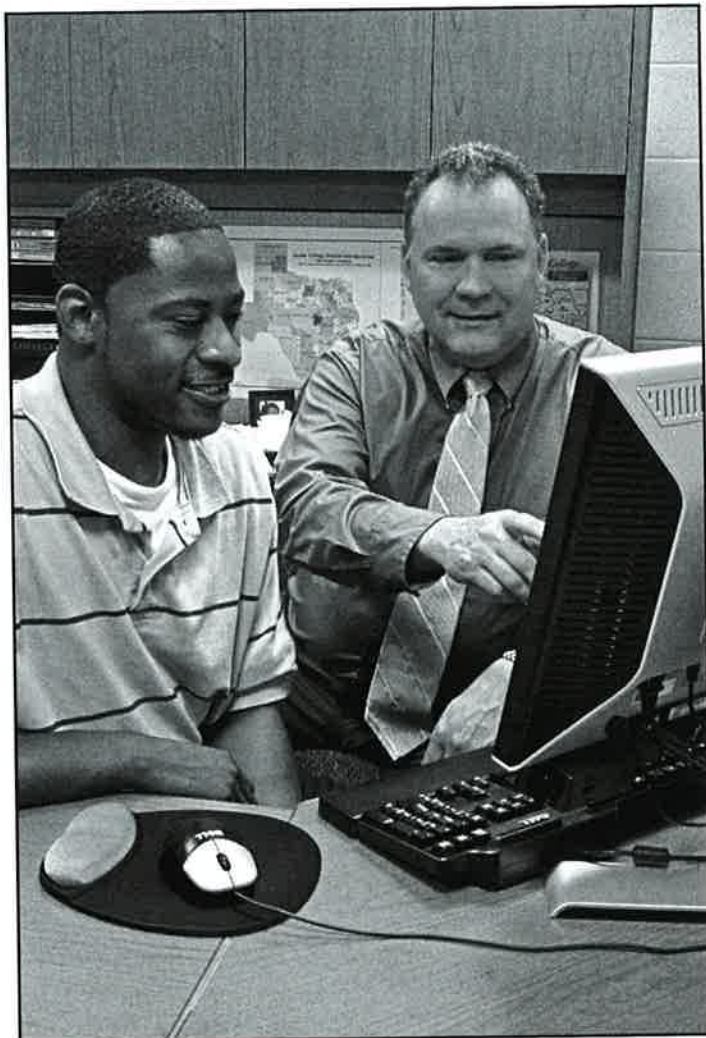
