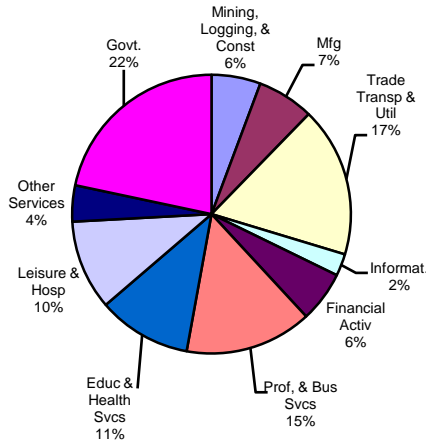
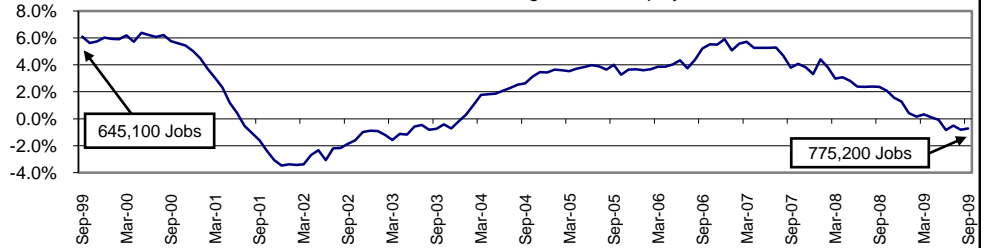


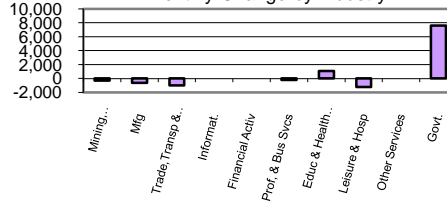
Industry Composition



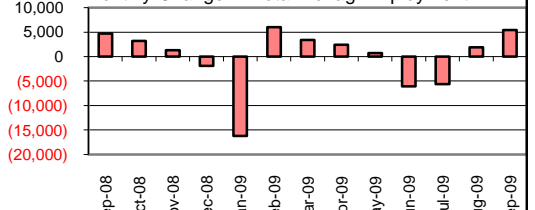
Annual Growth Rate for Total NonAgricultural Employment

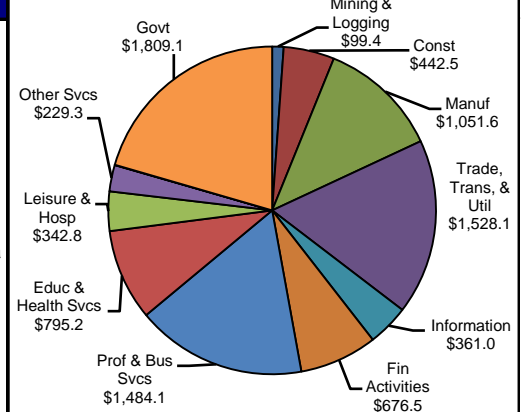

Comments for September 2009

Total Nonagricultural Employment in the Austin - Round Rock MSA increased by 5,400 jobs in September. This increase was in line with seasonal patterns for the Austin - Round Rock MSA. The majority of the new positions were due to employment gains in State and Local Government as area schools and colleges added staff for the new school year. Education and Health Services employment increased by 1,100 jobs over the month, but gained 2,900 jobs or 3.6 percent since September 2008. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities employment decreased by 1,000 jobs over the month. The majority of the decrease was in Retail Trade employment, down 800 jobs, which was in line with seasonal patterns for this industry. Manufacturing employment decreased by 600 jobs over the month. The annual growth rate in the Austin - Round Rock MSA was -0.7 percent, a decrease of 5,500 positions since September 2008.
